- V. Guest Speaker Chad Johnson AFSCME Area Field Services Director (AFSCME Strong)
 - a. Due to current political times, our mission to increase membership. Our current leadership is not Union friendly nor to working class. Unions must get involved and understand political issues that the Unions are facing.

- Supreme Court cases are coming up: Friedrichs v. California Teachers
 Association case is now a dead issue, but there are other cases in the pipeline.
 Supreme Court is now in President Trump's hands.
- ii. Anti-worker groups are well-funded and will not give up.
- b. Union is tracking 28 pending cases that threaten our rights.
 - i. Fair share can be outlawed in the private sector nationwide.
 - Right to Work Law introduced in 2017, and can be enforced in December 2017. If Union accepts the fair share dues after this is passed, then the Union will be penalized and penalties will be assessed.
 - a. Most states are part of the Right To Work (RTW). Iowa passed a more stringent RTW. This means that AFSCME must receive cards from the majority of members in order to represent their members and defend programs that would help the members.
 - b. California is the number one target for RTW due to membership percentage. Public sector workers are target number 1. Fair Share members will still be represented by the Union. RTW have not addressed this issue, but Fair Share members have stated that contract negotiations are still required.
 - c. There are more union members in the USA compared to other countries. Unions are fighting across the country and have won.
 - d. Currently, there is another issue regarding first responders: EMTs. Some classifications are fighting for their lunch breaks. First responders are not allowed to take lunch breaks. If an emergency arises, they must respond. If a member is using the bathroom, and the alarm goes off, they must stop and get ready. If the member is not ready within allotted time, they can be fired.
 - e. The power is within the active members and being active in the community. Positive Union news is not being reported by the media. Members should join the media Facebook to inform others of Union's activities within the community. AFSCME has forwarded their plan to save money, and cut down on office space. Unions must be financially stable to absorb the future political atmosphere and how this will affect their budget. Every local need to review their budget, and the percentage of fair share members. Be proud to be a Union member, and help other unions organize.



RE: COUNCIL DELEGATE MATTER

BACKGROUND & SUMMARY OF ISSUE

On January 27, 2017 I received an email from Cynthia McCabe, President of AFSCME Council 57, notifying me there was an error made by a staff member of Council 57 in calculating the number of delegates allotted to AFSCME Local 2620. She informed me that due to the mistake, AFSCME Local 2620 would be allowed 7 delegates instead of the 10 that were duly elected by 2620 members.

On January 28, 9 of the 10 duly elected delegates were present at the Council 57 delegate meeting. President McCabe prevented 3 of them from being seated and sworn in. She then said that due to the error made, only the 7 highest vote getting members would be seated.

I proposed a challenge during the meeting prior to the swearing in of any delegates, however, President McCabe deemed my protest out of order and continued on with the swearing in of 6 of the 10 duly elected delegates.

After the 6 delegates were sworn in, I continued to advocate on behalf of the 3 delegates that were not sworn in and proposed a resolution by way of a new election. I also proposed that Council 57 pay for the new election due to the error. I made the motion, it was seconded and passed almost unanimously. The motion did not authorize 2620 to hold another election, but was contingent upon whether or not our local board voted to hold the new election. If so, then Council 57 would pay for it.

On February 6, 2017 I called an emergency Executive Board (EB) meeting to present the details of the issue and entertain any motion regarding how it could be rectified. The meeting was called as an emergency in case there was a motion to hold a new election, we could save money by holding it along with the elections already in process (Atascadero State Hospital, Fairview Developmental Center and Region 11 Chief Steward).

The EB voted to hold a new election. After the EB voted to hold the new election, I reached out to the AFSCME International Judicial Panel to confirm the legality of holding a new election. I was informed that holding a new election may be out of order due to the fact that the original election results were never officially challenged by anyone. Therefore, all 10 delegates were duly elected and to hold a new election would set aside the results of a proper election that was never challenged. I then asked if anyone had the right to set aside the election results without a formal challenge and I was informed that any challenge to the election results would need to







have occurred during the allotted time period to legitimately challenge an election. There was never an official challenge to our election results, therefore all 10 delegates were duly elected and have a right to be sworn in.

On February 24, 2017, several Local 2620 members attended the Council 57 EB meeting to voice their concerns regarding preventing all 10 duly elected delegates from being seated and sworn in.

RESOLUTION

On February 24, 2017, the Council 57 EB passed a motion to seat all 10 of our delegates at the upcoming Council 57 delegate meeting on April 28, 2017. During the same meeting, the credentials committee also unanimously agreed to seat all 10 of 2620's duly elected delegates. Therefore, due to the fact that there was no official challenge to the election, it would be improper to hold a new election as well as prevent the seating of all 10 delegates.

The reality is that mistakes happen, but what happens after that is what ultimately define us.

State Controller **Betty Yee**'s office reported that February revenues came in \$772.7 million (10.6%) below budget projections for the month of February. All three major revenue sources--personal income taxes, corporation taxes, and sales and use taxes--came up short. Year-to-date, the Controller's figures show the state's general fund \$888.1 million below the revised current year (CY 2016-2017) estimates included in the governor's January 10 proposed budget for 2017-18.

The Department of Finance will come out with its own monthly fiscal report, likely next week. The two agencies use a different method of calculating revenue, although it all settles itself by the end of the fiscal year. The Controller's office uses "Controller's cash" meaning when the funds appear on the state's balance sheet. That's helpful in knowing the state's cash position at a given time. There can be a delay between when revenue is counted by agencies and when it's available for actual spending on the state's balance sheet.

Meanwhile, Department of Finance uses "agency cash," which reflects when the various taxing agencies (Franchise Tax Board, Board of Equalization, etc.) actually receive the payments even though they may not be credited by the Controller until the subsequent month.





Even with revenues running below projection, the state doesn't have a cash crunch, as the Controller identifies \$27.4 billion in "Available Borrowable Resources," which is actually above projections. These include the regular state reserve, the Proposition 2 "Budget Stabilization Account," and other internal borrowing. Each of these have different points of required repayment. This is not "free money," aside from the reserve, the available of the others are controlled by law.

April and June are the top two revenue months for the state and are expected to account this year for \$34 billion of the state's expected \$123 billion in state general fund revenues (27.6%) for the fiscal year, so we have a ways to go.

2017 Legislative Proposals

- 1. LPA reclassification Currently, there are roughly 40 Licensing Program Analysts that are working as phone intake coordinators in offices in Sacramento. Field LPAs see it as unfair that they are exposed to conditions that are more dangerous and are not required to fully analyze the severity of situations at community care facilities. The office staff is paid the same amount and we would like to see a separate classification for field staff with increased pay. Conference call scheduled on Friday, February 17th rescheduled. Still no date.
- 2. Adverse action coding An adverse action levied against a state employee is placed on a personnel file. Along with the details of the adverse action a code that identifies that an adverse action has been taken also is placed into the personnel database within the Controller's office. Government code 19589 assures state employees that after three years any adverse action is removed from their personnel file; but the coding from the Controllers personnel database is not removed. We would like to ensure that the coding is removed so that employees who have had their adverse action removed cannot be judged by future employers after seeing the code. Conference call occurred on February 9 with COS of Controller. They will be following up with

- us in the next few weeks with a letter stating their plans for this. There was an Assembly bill that I was hoping to add an amendment to to keep hiring authorities from seeing the coding; but the author has decided to change their bill to avoid a veto from the governor.
- 3. Currently, Social Workers have probationary periods that are equal to one year of state service. Psychologists and other professionals are only required to have a six-month probationary period. We would like it to be the same all the way across and lower the amount of time that Licensed Clinical Social Workers are on probation. This proposal must go through the SPB process. SWOC chair to do a survey
- 4. Gender Pay Gap in California State Civil Service CA GC 19827.2 is currently being ignored by CalHR. Many of our job classifications are predominantly populated by women and they are currently being paid significantly less than their male counterparts. This will probably not result in a bill but will be something we will be lobbying on and discussing with members of the Women's Caucus for guidance in dealing with CalHR. Joint hearing on gender pay gap set for February 22nd. Amendments to Gov't code 19827.2 are being proposed in a TBL buy Finance. Need to look at implications in what amendments would improve if any.

- 5. Chaplain staffing ratio The Department of Corrections (CDCR) actively seeks out certification through the American Corrections Association (ACA) which establishes high standards for prisons across the country. ACA standards code 4-4513, establishes a chaplain ratio of 500 inmates to 1 chaplain. CDCR circumvents these standards since getting certified only requires meeting a certain percentage of the overall standards. Currently, there are roughly 120 chaplains employed by the state. If those standards were met by CDCR 120 chaplains are to cover the spiritual needs of only 60,000 inmates. The prison population far exceeds that. We would like either a resolution in support of the 500 to 1 or see minimums met. Need to lobby for this during budget negotiations. Will need to schedule meetings once CDCR budget hearings are scheduled. Need to create budget proposal for this with total costs per year.
- 6. Review of Clinician to Patient Ratio within DSH this would be similar to reviving AB 2397 (Levine 2012). It would require an independent audit of the staff to patient ratios within DSH. Despite a DSH internal study having been partially completed (nursing and psych staff competed, phase 2 & 3, which includes BU 19 members is supposed to be continued), Finance has held onto the report due to cost.

Non Legislative Fixes

7. Chaplains continued service after DSH discharge – Penal code 5009 allow chaplains, upon informing the warden of the prisons, to continue to work with inmates who have been paroled to guide them in their spiritual journey. The Department of State Hospitals (DSH) does not have the same allowances. We would like to expand this service to chaplains within DSH. – Need to have a conversation with Legislative director on changing the internal policies.
